in destruction and perdition. For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows” (1 Timothy 6:9-10).

The message of the Gospel is that we be humble whether rich or poor. King Solomon prayed

that God would give him neither property nor wealth, but the food that he should have (Pro-

verbs 30:8). This shows true humility and that he had put his full trust in God. Jesus said,

“Blessed are the poor in spirit (humble) for theirs is the kingdom of heaven” (Matthew 5:3).

How can we be sure that we are not trusting in our possessions, whether we are rich or poor?

What would *your* response be if Jesus asked you to sell all you have and trust Him totally for your living? This can be a quick answer to let us know

where our security is. Someone has said, “The most important thing in life is never to have too much of anything.” It

is easy to have too much of this world’s possessions. But we can never have too much of Jesus

and His true riches. The Apostle Paul says in Colossians 2:2-3 that we should be rich in our

understanding of God and of His Son Jesus. There he says, “In whom are all the treasures of wisdom and understanding.”

Romans 10:12 says the Lord Jesus is rich unto all that call on Him. Here we can see that true

riches are in being saved. Again in Romans, Paul says, “O the depth of the riches, both of the

wisdom and knowledge of God” (Romans 11:33). How does a selfish person, whether rich or

poor, get the right attitude toward the things he has and wants to have? Can he just sell every-

thing he has and give the money away? No! There is no spiritual value in just being poor. It

takes the power of God in a person’s heart for him to place the right value on the things he has.

Remember our theme, “With God all things are possible.”

A wealthy person who is following God’s will has a proper attitude toward his possessions. The wealthy person must use his wealth for God’s

glory and for his eternal good. We are stewards of

Why is it so hard for a rich man to be saved? A wealthy person is one who has many earthly possessions. He is one who has more wealth than he needs to live. When someone is so well supplied with what he needs, it is hard for him to put his faith in God and to look to Him for his needs. To be saved, one must place all of his faith and trust in Jesus. In Hebrews 11:6 we read, “But without faith it is impossible to please him (God): for he that cometh to God must believe that He
